Murder Charge-23 Years Late

NORFOLK-A tall, gaunt, 63-year-old man asked Policewoman Bertha Annette Smith for directions to the police station Friday afternoon as she was standing in the back parking lot of the Public Safety Building on City Hall Avenue.

"He looked so old," she said of the shambling, partially bald man. "I said I would take him in because I thought he would get confused with all the turns in the hall to get to the Ist Precinct.

"Then he said he wanted to turn himself in for something he did in 1945," Miss Smith said. "He said, 'I killed a man in self-defense.' "

The man, who cannot read or write, was taken to the detective Bureau. He was wearing faded green work pants and a nondescript shirt as he sat in the corner of the bureau office telling the story for which he had traveled from North Carolina to tell.

The man said he lived in the 300 block of E.

Olney Road Sept. 9, 1945. Several friends came to his door, he said, and another man was with them. He did not want the extra man in the group to enter his house, he said, and told him

He told slowly and carefully how the man left his house, only to return later with a knife and try to enter.

The intruder was shot between the eyes with a .410-guage shotgun, the man said.

After the story was told Friday an old warrant was found in Central Files. It called for the arrest of Erank Allen on a charge of murdering Thomas Alston. The late Leon Nowitsky had drawn the warrent. His partner in the 1945 investigation, Officer E. M. Towe (now deputy police chief), was called in Friday to secure a new warrant because codes have changed in the 23 years since the shooting.

And on Aug. 9, 1968, Frank Allen was charged with murder in the shooting of Thomas Alston.
