Think of the matter of misery Here is a point that we need to be faced with.

The sin of greed. It might be translated covetousness. Or greediness.

Don't grumble because you don't get what you want -Be Thankful you don't get what you deserve,

In all ages of greed, is an ugly word and always it contains a certain basic idea as it is translated. It means arrogant greediness. That is, the spirit that tries to take advantage of his fellowman. Yes, it sealed his destiny. Ahab little dreamed that the innocent seed of greed in his heart would one day bring death and judgement.

Joseph's rothers planted the same seed. They sold their Godly brother into slavery. But little did they foreseen the harvest of famine and the misery when avarice came into full bloom.

You remember the rich man of whom Jesus spoke, who sowed a crop of selfishness and greed. The rich man soon came to know that his full barns and his full pockets was out an empty heart. And he was soon to drop dead with a voice in Heaven saying thou fool. This night thy soul is required of thee.

Juday was driven to greed - and he sold his Lord for 30 pieces of silver. And he found out that Ilfe was not worth living without Christ. So he cast aside the silver at the feet of the greedy men with whom he had made a poor bargain, went out, and hanged himself. And he was strangled by this sin.

Think of all of those like (Ahab) like (udas) and men of every age who have suffered misery. Christ says in Luke 12:21 - so is he that layeth up treasure for himself and is not rich toward God.

Another thing this does it cheats, it robs, it murders, it slanders to achieve its desires. The Bible tells us that these many sins are born as we read in Jer. 6:13 From the least of them - even unto the greatest of them. Everyone is given to covetousness. Little babies are born with selfishness. They have greedy natures. Though they cannot make requirements known in words, they have ways of making their desires known.

Sick, and in prison - you did not visit me. As you did it not to one of the least of these, you did it not to me. Depart from me, you cursed.
