Before the Offering

If yours is a typical congregation, an offering plate will be passed sometime during the church service. The offering is as much a part of a Sunday service as dessert is to a Sunday dinner.

Getting ready for the offering is far more than figuring one's tithe for the week. Or writing a check. Or finding the right envelopes for the right Sunday for yourself and each member of your family. Or depositing the envelope in the plate when it passes you.

Before the gift, there must be a giver. And according to the teachings of Christ, the giver must be more than generous. He must also be forgiving. Giving involves personal relationships as well as financial ability. Look at Matthew 5:23-24: "Therefore if thou bring thy gift to the altar, and there rememberest that thy brother hath ought against thee; Leave there thy gift . . . and go thy way; first be reconciled to thy brother, and then come and offer thy gift."

You may not actually get up and leave the church building this morning in the pursuit of reconciliation and forgiveness. But you can look around the congregation. Do you hold some secret grudge against a fellow member? Are you envious or jealous of someone? Even if you have been wronged, can you find it in yourself to forgive that person, and also beg God to forgive you of your unforgiving attitude?

When you do so, you will truly be prepared to make a rich and generous gift, for you will give more than money. You will be giving up your prejudices, and giving up is often more vital than giving over.
