He then earned an Associate in Arts from Old Dominion University, Norfolk, VA; B.A. from the University of Richmond, VA; Master of Divinity from Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary, Ft. Worth, TX, and a Master of Theology from Southern Baptist Theological Seminary in Louisville, KY. He completed post-graduate study at New College, University of Edinburgh in Edinburgh, Scotland and received the Doctor of Ministry from Southern Baptist Theological Seminary in Louisville, KY in 1973. Dr. Twine was baptized and ordained at South Norfolk Baptist Church by his pastor and lifetime friend, the Reverend Frank Hughes, Jr. He served as Pastor of Ivor Baptist Church, Ivor, VA, Broadview Baptist Church, Temple Hills, MD and Riverside Baptist Church, Jacksonville, FL. During the 1980s he was the Senior Vice-President and Eastern Division Coordinator of TOGETHER WE BUILD Capital Fund Raising Program- Stewardship Commission of the Southern Baptist Convention. Dr. Twine was preceded in death by his parents as well as his brothers Graham Louis Twine and Gillam Twine and his sisters, Irene T. Jones, Clara T. Parker and Lillian T. Bremner.


Survivors include many nephews and nieces and their families.

The Rev. Dr. H. Edgar Twine March 26, 2011 (Paraphrased)

Contentment – When I was a teenager I discovered Phil.4:11 where Paul affirms that he has learned to be content in whatever state he finds himself. This has continued to be my favorite scripture through the years ... Plan to be contented. It helps.

Attitude - We cannot always change events but we can control how we react to them. Abraham Lincoln once said that he believed that most people were about as happy as they made up their minds to be. If you plan to be happy you probably will be ... Learn to enjoy placid times...

Humanity - None of us are gods... We all make mistakes. To some extent we are all hypocrites - not always living up to our own principles, much less to someone else's ... We won't always be on top of the world. We'll have unacceptable desires. We'll be ill at times. That's being human and we have a right to be so...

Forgiveness – All of us are going to be mistreated and cheated from time to time. Life is not always fair... While we need to be aware of human evil...we need to cultivate a sense of forgiveness. We must not hold in our grudges and nurse them... A friend once said "I cannot afford to hate anyone – not because of what it would do to them but what it would do to me."

Reality – We live in a rapidly changing world and must not be overly threatened by change ... a new job, a new location, a new love, lost money, etc. We need ... to accept what we cannot change. Have aspirations but don't have unrealistic expectations...

Humility - You are not the greatest or smartest or best-looking person in the world. And why should you want to be? The whole universe doesn't revolve around you...

Sovereignty - God's - not yours ... I think most of us would be in despair if we did not believe that God is still in charge... Everyone needs to learn to love and that always means you have to be vulnerable to those whom you love so much. God's sovereign love means He places high value on each of us. We must have His kind of love for others where we want their happiness and well-being whether or not it includes us...
