These are persons who seem sincere, make a start and soon lose interest and stop coming to church, drop out of sight. Amazing how many don't like the preacher (I don't ask you to like me-Bor. I want you to love the Lord.) take offence at something said, or something done, they object to appeals for money, They had rather for you to have a circus at the evening service then a gospel sermon....

The season of trial, of temptation to much— these are superficial people who have to be rounded up preriodically to keep them in the fold.....

Temporgry at the best- the hot sun will get them.

III. THORNS 1.7, 14 Mot 7,22

This is the pre-occupied heart--- Worldly minded heart. This

Thes is a familiar dcene— It is like a garden lost in the weeds. It started well, but was soon choked out.

The church is full of members like this. They have little religion, but it is crowded out with cares, other interests until it bears little fruit...

They try to hold on to the interest of the world and of God at the same time. — one must suffer!

Worldly weeds choke out the word. the stalk soon turns yellow and dies.

The seed springs into life but there is no room for development.

It is robbed by the thorns of needed nourishment, Cumbered with much serving.

GOOD START-

ANXIOUS about their work, chothes—things that seemed harmless in apperance at first, but cares of world soon choke the seed of Grace.

HOW DOES YOUR, CARDEN GROW?

Luke 8: Matt.13:1-6

Intro: This is the season for planting gardens. All kinds of seeds are being planted. Here in the city there are a few spots left for ambishous garderners. We must plant potatoes, tomatoes, beans etc.... Then when the sun gets hot in June and July their energy begins to weaken and a for help sign is put up- weeds and grass have taken over...

For centuries the Japanese have cultivated the art of taking tall trees and dwarfing them. It takes a lot of time and requires careful tedious prossesing, careful watering, nipping buds and thinning roots. Keeping the roots in a given space. The old art goes back to the 13th century. These potted trees looking in every respect like the full size ones—yet miniature trees...

It serves as a good illustration of spiritual dwarfing...

Every one who has lived on a farm knows the value of roots. Surface roots are important, but the tap root must go deep into the earth—— Think of the giant Red wood tress—one grows to a height of 364 ft. high... General Sherman in the national park is $101\frac{1}{2}$ ft. in circumference & 282 feet tall. it is $18\frac{1}{2}$ ft. in diameter at 100 ft above the ground.

There is a difference in the giant Red wood that sends robss deep into the earth and the dwarfed potted tree with its matted clipped roots.

What about Xtian growth?

Jesus used a parable to show us how the garden grows...

- 1. The SEFD is the same in every case---
- 2. The difference is in the kinds of SOIIS ...
- 3. The REASON for the parable: Christ answer to the objection If the Gospel is from God, why is it not more effective?

We will notice that the seeds are scattered everywhere.. not limited to one spot.

We must note also that the seed is no ordinary seed. the life giving ellement in not in the soil but the seed. With out the

seed thate can be no life, appart from the indwellin gX there can be no life.

Not mans word ...

3. The GROUND: Heart

not the head of man but his heart.

See the Lord going out to plant a garden----

I. WAYSIDE - V.5, 12 Max 4,19

We know the effect of truth depends upon the spiritual state of the hearers.

The first heart described is like the hard trodden footpath through the field of grain.

No possible impression made ... The WORD finds no entrance.

Heart is trodden down by sin... His mind throws off the offers of X....

He is like a slate roof, it throws off the pieces of hail ...

Seed will not grow on a tightly braced drum-head...the slightest motion will shake it off.

A wise farmer would make the <u>foot path at</u> the end of the row, but this path is through the middle of the heart...

By custom and habit- this person and fgone from child hood to manhood with his heart getting harder each year....

He attends some services, but he does not hear much... his heart is unploughed, unbroken. This is the reason why preachers fail today, while he presents the Word the devil is at work, and the seed never penetrate beyond the intellect.

All of their Religion is on the outside. No Lodgment in the Heart....

Fouls devour the SEED --- Satan snatches them away. as birds pick up gr

The devil gets the grain before it sprouts, and takes roots.

No wonder the Sower must use good seed ...

Here are people who have heard the World, but they were careless hearers.....The impression is gone, and their hearts are hardended.

The word spoken never touched their hearts, did not touch their conscience. They never enter the soil, it may have been business, bitterness, sports, and the devil snacthhed away the things that might make an impression upon our hearts.

This is the superficial hearer --- Temporary hearer.

Stoney ground has a thin layer of soil over the top of the rock bed.

The seed is planted upon this thin layer of soil, and the seed springs up most quickly, because the soil may be warm on top.

The sun comes up- Juliah, Bush more, Hell fon - mrs Birth Withbred to dry up. Roots can not strick deep, and the grain soon witheres beneath the scorching sun.

These people reseive the message but when persecution and trials come they quickly desert. There is a hard heart underneath.

These persons enter a profession of Rel. before their hearts are thoroughly broken in the sense of sin.

Stoney ground is cold—what could be colder than a stone? These persons are without spiritual warmth.

Stoney ground does not drink in the rain which falls from heaven...

Stoney ground never brings forth perfect fruit ...

THE seed and plant must be exposed to the sun shine, but these weeds shade the plant.

The seed and plant have the capacity for growth --- good soil, every reason for growth,,,,,

No man can serve two masters.... Not enough room for seed and thorns...

.. But she d id not. Why? Her enemies along the way flung out pieces of gold Before her. The temptation was to strong and she stopped to pick them up. and so lost the prize.

The picture of one who starts on a siritual course and forfits all because they stop to pick up gold, etc.

Weeding work is painful---
