because she works 5 days a week out in the world and she said I need Sunday to keep house. You know it seems to me if you spent that such time in the secular world, you strely would want that to spend some time with God. Then people came and say to you, preacher, I don't want you to think I am trying to get out of something because I love my churke and so on, you know is mediately that they do not love the Lord very much. Peter's answer was Yes, Lord, I love you dearly. In other words he does not insist that he loves. Jesus more than some of the other disciples love Him perhaps he make s no claim that his love is superior to the others and he even passes the word that Christ that used by agapai, and he used the word philos which devoted personal affection that he loved Jesus as a friend in spite of all of his conduct he insists that he loves Him.

I can illustrate this with the life of an individual woman that I knew personally who used to be a member of the church where I preached. Her mane was Ers. Contest. She lost her husband diring the war. He was coming home from work and dropped dead seated in his car. She had two children and her mether stayed with her. Her no her had cancer. The boy was attending business college. The girls was in grad school. This mether taught the fourth grade in the public schools, kept house, cooked meals, and immediately you ask,

John 21:15-17

INTRODUCTION: Questions stir up thought. They call for an answer. Jesus used them often. Once He said to a woman "where is thy husband?" and it opened up a whole conversation concerning her life. The occasion is described in verse 15 They had fished all might. This took place after the resurrection of Jesus and we discover that He had formed a miracle in that they had caught a 153 fish and now they are on the beach, they have had breakfast together and seven of the disciples are standing around finishing up breakfast. It was after they had dired, they had all eaten and where filled. It was probably thable takk". We know that Jesus did not want to spoil the seal for leter therefore He did not bring up any distanteful subject and before they had the meal.

He sets the stage to ask him some personal questions.

Now He did not say I want to tell you what a coward you have
been. He might have said to him, we're going to take your
name off the roll of the disciples and expell you from our
group. We must remember, too, that Peter had already been
with the Master a couple or three times since the resurrection
and before this occasion. He did not tell him of his faults,
hastily, but deferred it for some time. He did not tell him

of it unreasonably to disturb the company at dinner. He did not go into a discourse with him about his treatment but He forgiven talked to him as a friend. The offense was not only given but was forgotten.

Verse 15. We have the first question asked. He calks

Peter by mane, it was direct, He wasn't concerned about anyone else except Simon, sen of John. He does not call him

Sephus, not does He call him Peter, the name that He had

given bim but He calls him by his criginal criginal name,

Simon. He calls him the son of John, to remind

him of his extraction. How mean it was and unworthy the

honor to which he was advanced.

The question is in 2 parts. First, "Lovest thou Me?", second, "More than these?" We deal first with imming levest thou me. This is a suprement question. If there is any doubt in our heart as to whether or not we are Christians we can make this inquiry, Do we love Him. No doubt Jesus puts this question here because of Peter's backwidden condition and He wanted to know whether or not he loved Him. He does not ask do you hear me, do you hence me, He does not ask do you admire me but do you love? We must recognize also the question is not Peter how much hast thou wept or how often have ye fasted because of your sinful soul? But do you love Me? The word for Love here is agapai. This is for love.

he notes the highest moral regards, the highest devoted love, from the soul. The humbler words for love is philes, for loves as a friend. We will deal more with this when we come to his anseer to this question. Here than there, the

second part of the question. At this point Jesus goes just a little deeper into the heart of Feter when He went to the intermest recesses of his heart. More than these. Do yo love me more than you love these parsons? Don't you lave me more than you love John or James your intimate friends, or Andrew your own brother, or your best friends. Another way to look at this Do you leve how a re than you love things? Such as your boats, your nets, more than all the pleasures of fishing, the occupation which you have been employed in Do you love Me more than you love all of these, So Jesus asked him fid he love Him more than he loved his secular business and his professions and also other people. know some people who would have a hard time snawering this part of the question. For example, I knew a woman once who lowed to work in community affairs more than she did in the church. I knew a man once who was so tied up in secular organizations that he had no time for the church. knew a wiman once to say, I can't take part in the church work because I have to fix big meals for my family on Sunday I knew a very capable parson who gave up her work in whurch

dealings? And indeed this is one necessary characteristic of a Christian. If you are to have any influence or power with Christ or to truly serve Him and count very much you must have this. I remember a service man by the name of Windingham who came to a Prayer Meeting once and I was teaching the book of Hosea. He told me at the door of the story of his life and how that his wife had sinned and he said, tonight you have told me to love mans side of it. Do you love Jesus enough to watch your language. You know many times people talk and it sounds like they were educated in Hell. I remember being in an old country store once where there was a little 4 year old bgy running around using profunity. No one tried to correct him. But many of the men just laughed and thought it was cute. But evidently they would be able to see the harvest of Hell if that life. Before he reaches 21 years of age.

Do you love Christ enough to stop your backsliding? Too
many times I believe that rededications and consecrations
do not mean a great deal to people. When a person comes and
rededicates his life to Christ, it ought to mean a change
a diffinite change, a decided change. It ought to mean more
than just a sham, a cover-over. I remember preaching in
a skew country church once where they had flickering oil
lamps hanging around the room for light. There had not been

was a teacher in one adult Sunday school class of women. She
was regular. She was an officer in an adult Union of Training
Union. She was there when the church doors were opened
Sunday morning, when they opened Sunday night, and she was
there Nednesday night for Frayer Neetings. She had time for
class meetings. Lovest thou more than these? And I think
that she could have said that. She was also a member of the
W. M. S. As I see it, it is a test of loyalty to God. I
don't see how one could be more obligated to home yet she
knew that she was obligated to God first.

Speciation, who go when they feel like it, and that is not too often, periodic, who go a Faster and Christmas, occasional, during a wedding or a funeral, loyal, who have no excuses and are there always.

I was ready to duck. He says, further ware I can preach better

sermons when I don't have tolook in your old mean faces sitting in the pees. The next week that man came back to him and said, You know, you started me to trinking. I went home and fell on my knees by my bed and confessed my sins. Emother Suttle said he turned out to be a goodnember. You know this business of love goes a little deeper than the surface. It goes down to the heart.

Jesus said to Peter, Feed my lambs. Feed my lambs. That means to feed as a hardsman, feed those that are wask. It is feeding rather than controling. These words implies assigned to Peter the work of a Christian shepherd whose call to lead the lambs of the flock into green pastures and the word lamb may be understood to refer to the still weak and immature members of Christ's flock., feeding rather than controling is the idea of the worb.

Verse 16. We cannot be the second question, where Jesus challenges Peter own statement. He calls him by name again and He challenges Peter's statement by saying Lovest thom me?

I remember hearing Dr. Clyde Turner once tell the story of a little quaker girl's dream. On her way to school she was peopl measuring themselves by goldenrod in the earth.

And as they stood by, this rod, they were bouched by an angel with a wand, they were grown or deminish in stature as a Sunday school teacher, stepped up, she noticed that she

diminished. A socila woman stepped up, she diminished. But an old scantrees stepped up by the golden rog grow. The little girls stood to be measured and she began to shrink. She cried out 0, angel, recording angel, don't write that down, I can do better. Afterwards she discovered that all of this happened while she was in a sleep, and it was on y a dream. But how true this is and Jesus says, Lovest that me? I wonder if we really measure up to the love that He expects of us. Again he says to Peter, feed my sheep, this time. We know the last time He told him to feed the lambs. And the lambs represent the young converts. Bow He comes to tell him to feed the sheep and we know that sheep in the New Testatment is symbolic of the Christian. And so this is an experienced Christian, this is a shepherding process, a little more authority is given here.

Verse, 17 We discover that He repeats His mane and when He uses the word love to question Peter this time, He uses the same work as used by Peter. Peter had answered I love you as a friend. Phileb, denoting warm, personal affection. Now Jesus challenges that.

As often as this has been repeated, I wonder, as we pause now to ask how much do you love Christ? Do you love Christ enought to be concerned for the wicked and promote His kingdom. Do you love Christ enough to be honest in all

puts the question to you, Lovest them We? Dees not there come before you some sin which greives your heart? Is there not some evil that disturbs your conscience? Is there not the thought of a failure here or there; that distressesyou?

The Answer. New Peter gives the answer. He appeals to
Christ himself for the proof of it. He said, Eard, you know
all about me. You know if I am truthful. He does not ask
his fellow-disciples to wouch for his love. Peter was sure
that Christ knew all things and particularly that He knew
his heart, that He knew the intent of it. Peter was satisfied
who knew all
with this. That Christ announced things knew the sincerity
of his love to Him.

It is a terror to a hypocrite to think that Christ knows all things.

But it is a comfort to His sincere Christians that He has Christ to appeal to. Christ knows us better than we know ourselves. When He speaks that God knows all about him, he remembers that experience back on the mountain when he suggested that three tabernacles be built that they might reside there with Him and now he says, He known, whether you love Him or not and that that is exactly the position of our Lord.

There is a story of fiction concerning Tony from Italy.

a soul saved in that church in over 2 years. They had not baptized an individual in that limgth of time. And one night a man came to rededicate his life and he said that he had been a Christian for 37 years and that was the first time that he felt like rededicating his life to Christ and I tell you it made a change in his life because there were some people in the church that he had not spoken to in a long time and he was not friendly towards and sertainly revival came to that church become of that incident. Do you love Christ enough to consecrate your life to Him? Are you willing to do that? They will be in a position to plea for the lest. Or will you be like Pholix who said, Go thy wayand when there is a more convenient season then I will give attention to this important. You remember Aaron Burr who said I'm almost persuaded to become a Christian but after talking it over with the president of the college he says, I will wait until the excitement is over and one night he pulled down the shade in his bedroom and told God good-by. And he said after that he never had a desire again to become a Christian . who ", but a dear to dee has , him to been ever

Do you leve Christ enough to let people know about it, I to witness, to other people and to let them know that you leve Him? I remember at Zion church on eastern shore how I suggested one night that the people let each other know whether ernot they loved each bther and there was a gray-headed woman that it seemed that over half the people in the house. went to shake hands with. She had been a nurse in that community, she had taught a Sunday school class for h0 years. I also saw in that service a woman who came to the paster. her husband followed her and she thought that he wanted to get by and talk to the paster but he planted a big kiss on her cheek with the tears rolling down his sun-tanned face. That old farmer suddenly wanted to let her know concerning his love. Jams told Peter this time, feed my sheep. My little is really what He meant to say and He refers to the weak, immature Christians. These little sheep referred to the Christians who had been converted ling enough to be mature but they were still in their rustic state of undevelopment. What you would call a "rut". The major ty of Christian people that I know are little sheep, as Faul says, "For when my reason of the time ye ought to be teachers, ye have need again that someone teach you the rudimentsm of the first principles of the arieles of God and are become such as are have need of milk, and not of solid food, " Hebrews 5:12. It is semething like trying to feed them with a spoon just as if they were babies. They have not moved up any, they can go back and tell you when they were converted, but they do not grow. Paul refers to little women of Which aur

translators call silly women when he what he means by little wemen is not the little women that Louisa May Alcott writes about in her book Little Women, girls that soon will be women. Paul does not mean little in stature but a woman with a little soul. Her soul is so small that she loves pleasure more than God, the world is higger to herthan heaven, the pleasurem of galety of this world are more to her than God's service. The ball room fashionable parties and so on that she seldon gets in touch with the spirit of Jesus Christ. Now this is manifest in the church. Little women, quite, small, they may be worth one million dollars, they may be leaders in society, but such are little women and this causes a pastor's heart to be heavyy because the mix sheep do not grew up, they remain little. Therefore he is to food the lambs with the proper food and also the sheep with the spiritual food and to lead them in the green pastures.

Feter was greived. If Christ had asked you 3 times if you loved Him, I wonder how you would have felt. It reminded him first of all of John 13:37, when he had made a boast that though all men should deny Him that yet will not I, and then in a second place it reminded him of the time when he danied 3 times. There was a threefold denial and now Jesus comes with three questions to ask him three times whether or not he loves Him. Matt. 26:6-9

Do you know what Ged means to you and you don't need to delay about it, but you need to come now and pledge your alligiance, the alligiance of your heart to Him.

Is is a secret? Why of course, we should not keep it a secret. If we love Jesus Christ, we ought to let Him know. You renember there is an old hymn whichsays, O love that will not let me go. Your life is very such like a man on a big island with the tide rising and a life beat comes
