ELON BAPTIST CHURCH

Elon Baptist Church, the first church in Pamplin, was founded April 5, 1859. It was first called Elon Baptist Church of Christ, J. S. Jason, the first pastor, donated the land which was in a grove of Oak trees, from which the name Elon, meaning Oak was derived. We worship in the same original building with alterations and additions. There were 19 men and women, including some slaves, who were charter members of Elon. Most came from Mathews Baptist Church located in Hixburg. From its early beginnings, God has richly blessed Elon and its people as it has ministered in the Pamplin community.

Early ministries of the church were combined with the ministries of the churches in the community along with three other churches in the area: Provident Baptist, Mathews Baptist, and Glen Memorial Baptist. Each pastor of Elon has had very special gifts that God has used to define the mission and ministry of the church while they serve at Elon. The first pastor was Elder J. S. Mason who served from 1859-1863 and again in 1873. Elder William Moore was pastor from 1863 to sometime during the Civil War. He lost his pastorate because he went to a political meeting when

he should have been at the church meeting. T. C. Alderson served as pastor during the summer months of 1874. John Horace Newbill served as pastor from 1874 to 1882. During his pastorate Elon was host for the first time to the Apportation Baptist Association for their annual meeting (1879). The next several pastors served only short times: E. A. Leonard (1883-1887), D. S. Hubble (part of 1888), and S. U. Grimsley (part of 1888), John H. Couch from Louisville, Kentucky was pastor from 1892-1901. He married Miss Sallie Love Terry from Spring Creek Church.

After Rev. Couch, several other pastors came with short tenures; W. E. Warren (1904-1905), J.J. Cook (1907), T. H. Binford (1908), W. S. Royall (1909-1910). During Rev. Royall's pastorate the first parsonage was built. Rev. C. R. Norris became the next pastor in 1911. In 1914 he died from measles. Rev. Clarence E. Taylor (1914-1917) emphasized training Sunday School teachers during his pastorate. The church was without a pastor in 1918 but many people joined the church during the pastorate of Rev. C. K. Hobbs (1919-1921). Under the leadership of Rev. W. B. Duling (1922-1929) the first Sunday School class rooms were built. Mrs. Duling organized Elon's

(1919-1921). Under the leadership of Rev. W. B. Duling (1922-1929) the first Sunday School class rooms were built. Mrs. Duling organized Elon's first B.Y.P.U. and was greatly loved by all the young people in the community. Rev. William M. Black, often referred to as "Dean of Ministers", came to Elon on Easter Sunday in 1931 and stayed until 1943.

The furnace was purchased during his pastorate. It was said of him that his life "has given to all of us the most convincing proof of the power of Christ in a life that quietly and consistently, day in and day out, allows the Spirit of Christ to shine

through words and deeds."

Rev. John Sterling Moore became the next pastor (1944-1950). During his pastorate church pews and pulpit furniture were installed. He came from Louisville Seminary as a bachelor but soon married Martha Paulette who had relatives in the community. Rev. J. Parks Hackney served July 1950-1953. Under his leadership, carpeting was added to the sanctuary as well as a new piano. He also led the church to begin deacon rotation. Rev. Harold Anderson was pastor from June 1954 to 1959. Under his leadership Mathew Baptist united with Elon. Also the church erected a new brick parsonage, 1959, Rev. Leslie Hart became the new pastor and served until 1967. During his pastorate, he brought the church together in closer unity. Rev. Olin V. Glidden was pastor from 1967 to 1969. In 1969 Rev. Ray Harley became pastor and served for a year. Rev. Harley built the bookcases that are in the Pastor's study even today. In 1970, Elon called John P. Campbell to be its first full-time pastor. Rev Campbell was loved by all and the church grew under his loving leadership. He served from 1970-1975. Rev. Doug Hager served as pastor (1976-1977). Elon then called Rev. Bill Trimyer (1978-1980). Dr. Trimyer was blessed with many gifts with which to serve God. He was a dynamic speaker, gifted writer, a

St. John's Baptist Church Cemetery
