What a sight! 150 forches burning corn, orchards, vineyards.
15:6 - Philistines burn his wife and her father.
15:8 - avenges the family.

15:11-16 - sought to capture Samson
15:18-19a - need little comment
16:1-3 - surrounded

16:4-6 wicked woman, a devil
16:8-9 green withs
16:11 - new ropes
16:13-14 pin to beam
16:17 - seeking to snare her man - nagging, crying,
weakened.
- 16:21 - tragedy - eyes out, never again see. Laps
of Delilah are numerous today, worldly, material
love of ease, laps of doubt.
- VIII. Samson made sport of - 16:23-25
- IX. Samson strengthened - 16:26-30
Deep in his heart there must have been an invisible
fire - faith in God. Soul burned with in. Fire of
concern, "Let me die with them"
- With all weakness and sin, he was appointed of God.
He was a backslider. Persistence of a wrong woman. He
comes back into the favour of God. He is listed in He-
brews 11.
