Many years ago (1807) two individuals in this world held a conference on a

At 1 o'clock precisely on the 25th, the boats pushed off from opposite sides of the stream and rode toward the raft. Out of each boat stepped a single individual. And the two met in a small wooden apartment, in the middle of the raft, while cannons thundered from the shore. And the shouts of great armies were up along the banks. The two persons were the emperors — Napoleon and Alexander. And the history of the time tells us that they met to arrange a destiny of mankind.

The hastily constructed raft on which the interview took place will be remembered as long as the story of great conquest and mighty revolutions can interest the mind of man. The conference there lasted two hours It was entirely private between the two emperers. And yet, the consequences would touch millions of people. It was a great crisis in human history. When the powers of government of the nations, met together in that interview, that night.

Now we go back 1800 years beyond the treaty that was worked out between those two individuals. And we come to another conference that was held in private between two individuals that was far more momentos and lasting than between Napoleon and Alexander.

There were no great armies standing by, it was not hailed by the thunder of cannons. The interview had not been arranged before hand. Nor had anyone guarded the safety of the two in this meeting. It was a private house It was a late hour. It was at night. And one was an anxious old man, who had come to know and to discover something from a young teacher who had recently appeared in the city.

This is a humble conference, interview, at night between Jesus and Nicodemus.)

And the light from this interview has gone out to the ends of the earth.

Now the plans that were formed by Napoleon and Alexander were reversed and defeated long ago. And it is impossible to trace their influence in the conditions of Europe today.

But the words and the plan spoken by Jesus, and to his listener that night - have already changed the destiny of immortal millions.) And has had more influence in the previous age and they are destine to go on and to increase in power as long as this world shall stand to influence millions of others.

I want us to use tonight as a <u>guideline</u> for this interview - first, the place. Second, the Pharisee. Third, the pursuit. Fourth, the proposition. These words will help us to weave our night interview into a complete story.

I. THE PLACE

The place was in Jerusalem and it was the occasion of the feast of the Passover.

Jesus had come down to keep the great national feast at the sacred city. (Multitudes) had come on the same errand from distant nations. The houses in Jerusalem were full.

The streets thronged. The court squares were crowded. The valleys and the hillsides were covered with tents.

Josephus says by actual count on one occasion it was found that 256,000 lambs were slain between 3 and 5 o'clock in the afternoon. And that 2 million 700 thousand persons. That is a tremendous number of people. More than the population of many of the large cities, in America — took part in the feast. So great was the multitude that the small city caused one to have to struggle through the crowded narrow streets. The overflow of pilgrims camping outside the city. The place was alive with people. This was the place.

The temple was the chief attraction where the multitudes entered for the daily sacrifice, that had been offered for the thousand years. And the service led by the priests and the levites. And supported by thousands of voices in the great congregation. As they assembled under the domes, the columns, and the arches, and aisles. The whole area of the holy hill was a thing of beauty.

There was greetings and gatherings of friends after long separation.

The passionate enthusiasm with which the Jewish people entered into the great national festivals could be felt.

This could not be repeated elsewhere on the face of the earth. The Passover was the most stern, impressive, ceremonial that has ever been observed by any people.

The clace was Jerusalem at the time of the Passover. And when the night of the great festivities came to a close, the multitude of Jerusalem divided into little companies to eat the lamb and to sing the songs of the Passover. In the early morning preceeding the festive night, Jesus mingled with the crowd.

We do not know whether or not this was exaggerated but we do know that he brought a mixture of myrrh and aloes, about a hundred pound weight - and only a wealthy man could have brought that.

It is safe to say though that he was a man of high distinction, in Jerusalem. The Pharisees were the best people in the whole country. There were never more than about 6,000 of them. And they were formed into a brotherhood.) This brotherhood was formed by taking a pledge in front of three witnesses.) That they would spend all of their lives in observing every detail of the Scribal law. Now what That meant that to the Jew, the (law)was the most sacred. exactly did that mean. The law was the first five books of the Old Testament. The perfect word of God. To add one word or to take one word away was a (deadly sin). (Later) the Jews, however, felt that the law was not complete and did not contain everything that was necessary for the living of the good life. So they had to add some mules and regulations. And there were an infinite number of rules and regulations to govern every conceivable situation in life. For (example), the Sabbath Day, they had some rules and regulations that took up 64 1/2 columns, in one section of the law. It was very detailed. For example, concerning a know - it had to be defined. Now a man who was guilty - for example the knot of the canel drivers or that of sailors - and one is as guilty by reason of tieing them or also of untieing them. On the other hand, the knot was tied by hand, by a woman, could tie the strings of her cap or those on her girdle, it was (not a sin.) You can see that happened. When a man supposedly wanted to let down a bucket in the well to draw some water - he cannot tie a rope around it for a knot on a rope was illegal. But he could tie on it a woman's girdle and let it down. For a knot on a girdle was quite legal.

The cribes who worked out these regulations and the Pharisees who dedicated their lives to keeping them, is exactly what the word Pharisee means. Separated one.

Nicodemus was a Pharisee. He was a ruler of the Jews. A member of the court - the supreme court of the Jews and a very distinguished man.

And he removed the trade, the trading voices that were mixed with praise and prayer.

And he bade these bargaining crew to leave the holy place and to take their merchandise with them. He over threw the tables and scattered the changers money on the marble floor. And of course, these hardened men felt and obeyed his word.

All day he had instructed the people - reasoned with them. Talked with the Scribes. Healed the sick. Assisted the blind and the lame, that had been brought to him in great numbers.

Night came and the crowded city was calm and he must seek a place of rest.

Of quiet retreat. And I suspect that on the slopes of the Mt. of Olives - we do not know exactly the house. But the place was here.

II. THE PHARISEE

Among all those who had heard his words, there was perhaps this aged outstanding in man who was powerful, among the people. He could not sleep another night until he had known more about this wonderful teacher. This man who had come out of Galilee.

This old man was a Master in Israel the Bible tells us. V. 1 - He was a Pharisee and a ruler of the Jews. That is, he was a member of the national council among Jerusalem and he was wealthy. And his learning and his liberality was known around among them.

The Jewish talmud speaks of Nicodemus of being very very rich. He was so rich that he could support a whole city, ten years on his resources. And could give his (daughter 5 millions of dollars.) Wo Mannings

They will read books hear lectures, and write letters and travel a far to get information about houses, lands, goods, worldly occupations.

There are people today who would travel to the ends of the earth to find some old piece of antique that is broke down - that they have to work hours and hours to try to restore it. That is nothing compared with what Jesus can tell us about ourselves, about God, about Heaven and about eternal salvation.

Yet men are reserved and cautious and sensitive. They will not become earnest to know what they shall do to be saved.

Men who can talk fast and well on everything else will be silent and shy when it comes to this grand question — what is to become of us, when we leave this world.

Surely it ought not to be so. If there is one thing about which a wise, conscientious man should not hesitate or have any reserve or fear - it is about

So Nicodemus, this Pharisee, wanted absolutely a private interview. And he comes at this hour away from the crowds.

LII. PURSUIT

Now the place was Jerusalem. The Pharisee was Nicodemus. And now the pursuit, or

Jesus had been busy all day and perhaps Micodemus also and had not been able to talk with this remarkable person. And he wanted to do so at a time when he would not be interrupted. And he chose to wait until the crowd had dispersed and the streets had quieted down. When Jesus had gone for rest at night.

2. Night Time So in your imagination this old man, in this late hour - this Pharisee leaves his own home without letting it known where he is going to be. He travels down the lanes and the alleys of the city, and he stumbled along over the beasts and the homeless pilgrims lying out upon the pavement. And he passes out the Eastern gate which was kept open all night the week of the Passover. And he perhaps went down a path in the valley of the Kidron, and there he came and quietly found the Galilean teacher. Who was lodging for the night. And what excuse he gave for himself for coming at that late hour and how the conversation began - we can only imagine. But he committed himself.

What will be said in the city when it is known that here a Pharisee, a rich honored man, has come to Jesus to talk to him confidentially and have a night-time interview.

There are men roday who doubt and who hesitate to come to Jesus because of what they think of what others will think of them. But here is something - Christianity has been in the world 1800 years and it is proved that it is the power and the source of life. And yet there is hardly anything about which men are so slow and so unwilling to be seen and heard inquiring about Jesus.

They have no hesitation to talk among themselves and to be anxious about trade - price = work - health. And the means of living.

In this interview (Nicodemus) is sitting here in silent amazement. Here is the kingdom of God and I cannot enter it unless I become a new man.

This is the one great (truth) which lies at the foundation of all instructions that will make the world better and happier. It is the (idea) that man is lost and needs renewed. And this is a full practical acceptance of this truth, brings the entrance into the kingdom and blesses a life.

It is a new heart - pure, lovely, loving, obedient. A heart that shuns evil - seeks good, and makes a happy choice. And Jesus is talking to this man about this. This pursuit is to discover truth, and (Jesus) is giving him the remedy for a new spiritual life) on that memorable night, in that obscure house, in that night scene in the Bible when the interview took place. The greatest thing was discussed. More important than that which has been discussed by cabinets of kings, or councils of nations. With nothing but the words of Jesus and Nicodemus. We could use these words - and we could crusade against all the wrongs and the miseries.

Man's life is wasted by proversion - he needs to begin all anew. And to have life from above. Man is subject to the old sin and misery. He must be made a new the quest of this man.

Now remember Nicodemus was rich, powerful, learned, a member of the proudest group. And yet, it was much to his credit however he came and acknowledged himself and inquire in quest of truth. He came unsatisfied seeking after light.

So many eople say, well, one belief is as good as another. Just so you are sincere - after all, we are all striving for the same place. I have my own idea and you have yours.

What about the quest. And what about the pursuit of this man Nicodemus. What happened when he came to Jesus and wanted to question him. Did he ask Jesus who was Cain's wife. Now I have always wondered about that. You are the son of God, you came from God, tell me about it. Did he ask him did the whale really swallow Jonah. Tell me whether or not that was a myth or not. And then he might have said, I am wondering about these heathen on the other side of the world who have never heard the Gospel. No, when you are face to face with God. You are not going to talk about these things. He said O Master, tell me about the kingdom of God.

Jesus answered Nicodemus, in order to see the kingdom of God, to have eternal life, to be saved - you must be born again.

Now you may not understand this. Like the wind Nicodemus. You may not understand the gale. Where it comes from and where it is going. But you can see the trail - there are the flattened trees and the uprooted trees. And the results that are left behind by the wind. So the spirit comes into human lives and changes the picture.

Dr. John Hutton used to tell about a workman who had been a drunken reprobate but was converted. When he went back to work, some of his best friends tried to make him feel like a fool. They began to ask him questions and one of them said to him - surely you cannot believe in miracles. And things like that. Surely, they said, you do not believe that Jesus turned water into wine.

This new convert said, I don't know, whether Jesus turned water into wine. When he was in Palestine - but I do know that in my own house and home, he has turned beer into furniture.

IV. PROPOSITION

Now we have discussed the place in Jerusalem where the Pharisee Nicodemus came

If there is any doubt, the need of this change fits your life. Consider what the Bible says about it. It says that men without a Saviour are lost creatures. That Christ comes to seek and to save that which was lost. The Bible describes the roaming nature of the disposition of man. That he cannot feel at home, at ease in Heaven. And there is no denying that the Gible gives very hard names to all who have not put on the new name, and the new man. It says first of all that you are dead in trespasses and in sin. It says that you are in bondage and a mighty deliverer must come and free you. It says that you are blind to your obligations. And your eyes need to be opened.

When you come with as much earnestness about the Bible, the best men who ever lived on this earth have had to pour out their souls in sorrowful, agonizing confession. Because they felt their need of divine source.

Now that is the way the new birth is. Jesus comes in when we are reborn.

the spring when things come forth. And life will not begin at 21 or at 40.

Life will begin for you with the new birth. When you experience this. Jesus said accept a man be born again, that man is doomed. No matter how low, how high, how sinful you may be. He is doomed. And the only way to change your life is to change your heart.

What example can we use - here is a person who has an old crabapple tree in the back yard. It produces sour apples. Knotty. Wormy. And the man wants to produce some sweet fruit. The man says I am going to make that a peach tree. So he pulls off the crab apples and he gets some ripe peaches and ties them onto the tree. And he tells someone to look and see - I have a peach tree. Just covered with peaches. We'll have peaches from now on. Now that's what he thinks. That is stupid. You just pulled off the sour apples and put on the sweet peaches. You haven't changed that tree - it is still the sour crab apple tree.

Now the proposition tonight is, that you will not solve your problem of sin by simply pulling off a few of the sour sins that you have and your habits and put on a few good works. And you say, I know I have been bad. Man cannot save himself - he must be born again.

Are you the preacher? Well, there is not much I can do for you he said. But Jesus can And he took out his New Testament and he began to read from the Bible what it had to say about sin. He read also what it had to say about the Saviour. And then he read to her what it said to her about the new birth. And the girl began to confess. I've had all the drugs of life.

birth. God works in a human heart. He said to Nicodemus - listen to the wind.

The night is full of it. The wind is in the top of the olive trees. You know the holy Spirit is just like that with ceaseless action. And the spirit tonight - and the proposition is that no man can control this. And Jesus said, if you want to be saved. If you want your life changed. If you want to see a great work take place and be manifest in your life. No man can track it or diagnose it. No man can know, where the spirit will stop or where the spirit will lead him. And no man tonight should say in his life, my life is fixed. I'll never be changed.

Now the complete change can come, because God will make the change the moment you open your heart.

There is a story told by Dr. A. B. Simpson about a young man who appealed to him for spiritual help. One day the young man said to Dr. Simpson, I'm all right when I am with you but when I am away from you, I do not seem to have the strength to resist: temptation.

His teacher, A. B. Simpson said, suppose it were possible for me to get inside of you and live my life in you and through you. Do you think that would solve your problem.

Most assuredly replied the young man.

But said Dr. Simpson) you must believe that the Scriptures teach that you have one greater than I living in you. For every believer has Jesus Christ abiding in his heart. He is your life. It is your privilege to let him live his life in and through you.

I left my mother and have been living an awful life. I've committed all kinds of sins. And soon she came to surrender her heart to Christ like Nicodemus and in tears she said, "I give my heart to Jesus Christ." Isn't it wonderful that Jesus can save a sinner like me.
