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THE BOLD CROSSING

Joshua 1:9

In these days of thinking about bold missions, as we have a slogan, of the bold mission thrust. Of confronting everyone in the world with Jesus Christ by the year 2,000. Don't let anyone say that this is not bold. And don't let anyone go away from this service without Jesus.

Peter Marshall said one time that the church reminds me of a man all dressed up in a deep sea diving outfit, marching bravely to put a stopper out of a bathtub.

There was an ad that appeared in the London Times in 1900 Signed, Sir Edward Shackleton. The polar explorer ("Men wanted for hazardous journey, small wages, bitter cold, long months of complete darkness, constant danger, safe return doubtful. Honor and recognition in case of success.") That is a challenge of being bold.

When God told Moses and the children of Israel to go forward with the Egyptian

Army behind them, cut off to the right and to the left, Moses told an uncourageous

people to go forward. That was one bold mission.

Kaleb was told at age 80 - you can have any part of the land that you want.

Just tell me where you want to live. Joshua invited. And Kaleb looked up to a mountain Where giants were dug in. And no battle had been fought to run them out. He turned to Joshua and he said - "give me that mountain." That was another bold mission.

than by the Holy Spirit to move you by the spoken word. In Joshua 1 - after the death of Manuar - the Lord spoke, V. 2 Moses, my servant, is dead. Now therefore, arise and go over this Jordan. And then in the 9th verse, he said, have I not commanded thee to be strong and of good courage. Be not afraid, neither be dismayed. For the Lord, thy God, is with thee. Whether soever, thou goest.

As a candle awaits fire to light, as a canvass awaits the artists touch, for beauty - the company of God looked to the word of God for his command.

This truly is a bold venture. God called Joshua to face new frontiers. They had parted company and had left Egypt. They had been 40 years wasting in the wilderness. To stand in the promised land. There was great excitement.

Think how the Bible arranges this. Israel is camped. The mountains of Moab and the Jordan River, and the flowers and the trees growing. And here is the streams flowing from the mountains of Moab down to the Jordan River.

God is ready. At one moment he spoke to Abraham and told him his desires. At another moment, God spoke to Moses. And God used the plagues and the marvels of the morning manna. And 40 years in the desert. And many were left in the grave-yard. Here was an appointed people, they were at an appointed place, at a time with the appointed leadership and the appointed task.

V. 2 Second, there was a great announcement to his man Joshua. God said, Moses, my

servant is dead. Impossible. The shock waves went through the people as they saw their only leader was now dead. It never occurred to them that Moses would ever die. They thought that Moses would live forever. But Moses was dead. Moses had delivered the people of Israel. And he had brought to them the law. And God beckoned to Moses to come to the mount Nebo - and there Moses died at 120 Clear of eye, steady of hand, and no one knows where Moses was buried. For God, himself, layed his body to rest on the top of the mountain.

Woses. Whom the Lord knew face to face. God loved Moses. And how much he must have

But Moses committed a serious sin, and God could not change that judgement. The people of Israel loved Moses for a whole month, and mourned his death. And in the context that is when Joshua steps forth, as the new leader. Years earlier, God had chosen him for this position of leadership. And God had instructed his new leader. It was a terrifying experience. To follow a strong and illustrious leader. If Joshua was a normal man, as we have every reason to suppose, that he was he must have had butterflies in his stomach. He had been ordained to be sure. But to transfer this responsibility was a great undertaking. The past was over. And there was new hope and a new future. God works through men. And God is not limited to a man. God has Joshua waiting in the wings. Joshua never dreamed to be the commander in chief. When he spied out the land - he little realized that God would somehow put on him that responsibility. Gave you ever tried to lead a club, a civic group, or a class or department, it is difficult

gave him the attitude of mind that he needed. Be strong and of good courage. Strong meant resolute. Determined, unswearving. Courage meant to be fearless, and bold in his leadership. And to execute his responsibilities.

Do you know many of the battles of life are won or lost in your attitude. You convince yourself that you cannot witness as a friend of Christ's, and you can't.

Fear will possess you. If strength of courage or duties - then weakness and fear are sins.

Every man and woman looks back to some place, maybe some country place, when your heart was strangely warmed Did you know that God was getting you ready at that time.

Even preachers way back, when they preached to just a very few people in a little country place, God was getting them ready. They did not have the capacity or the ability.

Joshua was no Moses. He was no prophet. He was a good man and he was a faithful soldier. And he wasn't to be discouraged. Because he could not lead like Moses.

service in Christ's kingdom. Let someone else do it. A person who allows himself to become overcome with fear, and is never able to be counted on in God's service, is committing a sin.

God commanded Joshua - observe to do all the law. Turn not from it to the right of to the left. That thou mayest prosper wheresoever thou goest. Now, God instructed him to stay close to the word. 'V. 7-8. And he would have good success. His guidebook was the law for leading the people. And the law revealed the heart of God, and secondly it revealed the kind of lives the people were to live in order to realize their destiny. And every decision of leadership that Joshua made was in the light of that law. This is still true after over 3,000 years after Joshua. The law that was given to Joshua and on Mt. Sinai, is just as good in our day as it was in the time that it was given. The reason is that, neither God nor man have changed. Man's mode of living has changed considerably since the days of Joshua. But the issues of life that he faces, have not changed in the slightest. And God told Joshua, if you would live by the law, you would succeed. The same promise applies to every person here.

A person cannot keep from prospering and being successful in life, if he will live by the Word of God in these relationships. His personal life, his family life, his social relationships, his spiritual life, his business dealings.

God promised to be with Joshua - be not afraid. V. 9. Just as God walked with Moses and talked with Moses and sustained him, God promised to do the same for him.


