
A SHORT, SHORT STORY





The success of my ministry has been largely due under God, to your co-operation and above all the goodness of our Heavenly Father.


Pastor and Family



FROM THE PASTOR'S STUDY



What is the trouble in America? One of Britians leading psychiatrists says it is wealth and women. If this is it, then both are necessary evils. For we have been penny-

pinching for years and yet the cost of living reveals that living costs!

"Americans are the most worried people in the world", so says Dr. Joshua Bierer. He explodes the old idea that plenty of wealth produces happiness. His theory is that women are responsible for the situation because they are trying to rule society. "The American man works himself to death at 40 or 50 and leaves rich widows. When men become goody "goodies" the women have nothing to look up to and she becromes unhappy and makes the man unhappy."

He further states that the whole American way of life is in danger. At this point we would all agree. We are trying to buy a certain kind of life and happiness. Some have plans for family happiness and security through wealth.

The psychiatrist may be right on his two points, however, the Bible tells us that sin is at the root of all social disorder. There is nothing wrong with wealth or women. The evil is in the management of each. The real trouble in the U. S. and in Britian is within the hearts of all citizens — men as well as women are liable at this point. "For all have sinned" — not some — not a few — not the poor — not the rich, but "All have sinned and come short of the Glory of God".

We concede that some of the emotional and moral problems could be improved by up-grading the womanhood of America, also, by putting wealth to work for a good cause.
