

Decatur Church Setting for Wauchope-Hayes Wedding

Couple to Reside on Candler Street After Return From Wedding Trip

Before an altar of palms and Southern smilax flanked by candelabra and white gladioli and dahlias, Miss Laurie Tappan Hayes, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Robert Steele Hayes, of Decatur, will become the bride of Arthur Douglas Wauchope Thursday at 5:30 p. m. in the First Methodist Church of Decatur.

The Rev. J. W. O. McKibben will perform the service after a program of nuptial music presented at the organ by Miss Frances Burgess, with Miss Myra Barber as soloist.

Professor Robert Wauchope, cousin of the bridegroom, will be best man, and Robert Steele Hayes will give his daughter in marriage.

The ushers and groomsmen will include Robert S. Hayes Jr., brother of the bride, the Rev. Robert Earnest, the Rev. Joe Boyd and H. N. Stanton.

Miss Dorothy Hayes, sister of the bride, will be maid of honor and her sister's only attendant. She will wear a costume of hyacinth blue marquisette, fashioned over matching satin, in the redingote style, trimmed down the front with lace and featuring short puffed sleeves with full skirt made floor length. A clasp of pink rosebuds in her hair, she will carry a bouquet of garden flowers with pink roses predominating.

The bride, entering with her father, will be dressed in white marquisette and lace, fashioned on princess lines, with sweetheart neckline and short puffed sleeves. The full skirt ends in a short train over which will fall the bridal veil of Brussels lace, following the lines of the train, and finished in a halo effect caught to her hair with clusters of lilies of the valley. Her only ornament will be a single string of pearls, the gift of the bridegroom, and her flowers, a bouquet of lilies of the valley centered with orchids.

Mrs. R. S. Hayes, mother of the bride, will wear a costume of navy blue sheer, lace-trimmed, with a shoulder spray of pink rosebuds and accessories

of white. Mrs. A. D. Wauchope, mother of the bridegroom will wear a model of green and white sheer, with white accessories, and a corsage of gardenias.

Early in the evening Mr. Wauchope and his bride will leave for their wedding trip and upon their return they will reside on South Candler Street in Decatur. For her traveling costume, the bride has chosen a suit of navy blue mesh, with a collar of light blue embroidered linen, blue and white accessories and a corsage of orchids.
